

Following the outbreak of COVID-19 in March 2020, weekly newsletters were replaced with ongoing ClassDojo messages sent directly to parents. Many communications were sent to parents from teachers, but whole school messages have been copied here for information:

Dear Parents & Carers,

I'm sure by now that you will have heard that the government believe that their 5 tests are being met, and therefore plans should continue for partially re-opening schools next week.

As outlined in the organisational plan sent out on 22nd May (and also available on the school website), I will be contacting parents and carers with children in Nursery, Reception and Years 1 and 6 again tomorrow morning, in order to gather expected numbers to attend school from Tuesday 2nd June. That plan, along with the associated risk assessment (and the extra information sent to Nursery parents/carers today) will give you all the information you need in order to make an informed decision about whether or not to send your child back to school.

Can I please ask that all responses are made by 7pm tomorrow evening in order that the groups can then be arranged over the weekend for those confirming the return of their child(ren). We will then communicate your child's group to you on Monday, ahead of the re-opening on Tuesday.

There are currently no further plans at this time for the return of other year group children, but I will of course keep you updated if this changes. Please note that as previously communicated, if you require keyworker childcare this should be arranged by calling me on my mobile number XXXXX XXXXXX in the first instance).
